Ladies and Gentlemen,

In March 2002 the Missouri Public Service Commission issued an order establishing the Universal Service Fund for low income consumers and disabled individuals. That order adopted the low income and disabled proposal as agreed to by the Missouri telecommunications industry, the Missouri Public Service Commission staff, and the Public Counsel. The rules governing this fund are found in the Missouri Code of State Regulations at 4 CSR 240-31.

As the fund Administrator QSI Consulting is tasked with collecting data on intrastate jurisdictional revenues from telecommunications carriers. That data is used to develop and monitor an assessment surcharge percentage that is used to generate the funds required for the Missouri Universal Service Fund. Your company has received this request because its name appears as a certificated carrier in the Missouri Public Service Commission's Electronic Filing and Information System.

The reverse side of this document contains the data collection form that Missouri telecommunications carriers must complete. **Please note that the data requested is for the calendar year ended December 31, 2006.** We would appreciate your prompt attention in completing and returning this form such that it is received on or before May 15, 2007. The data collected will be treated confidentially and will be used only for purposes of operating the Missouri Universal Service Fund.
